ALLITERATION	Several words beginning with the same letter next to each other in the same sentence. Sara's seven sisters slept soundly in Stevenage.
ANAGRAM	A word or phrase formed by using the letters from another. FLOW/WOLF LOOPED/POODLE
ANTONYM	A word that has the opposite meaning to another. HOT/COLD EMPTY/FULL SHORT/TALL
COLLECTIVE NOUN	A word that refers to a group of people, animals, or things. A herd of cows, a flock of sheep
CONSONANT	All the letters in the alphabet that aren't vowels.
HOMONYM	A word that is spelt the same as another but has a different meaning. WOUND/WOUND DATE/DATE HANDLE/HANDLE
HOMOPHONE	A word that is pronounced the same as another but has a different spelling and meaning. COARSE/COURSE THEIR/THERE BOLDER/BOULDER
METAPHOR	An expression in which a word or phrase is applied to an object or action to which it is not literally applicable. Rishi has a heart of stone.
OXYMORON	A phrase where opposite words appear together. AWFULLY GOOD PRETTY UGLY SERIOUSLY FUNNY
PALINDROME	A word or phrase that reads the same when spelt forwards and backwards. RADAR KAYAK LEVEL MADAM
PERSONIFICATION	An expression where human qualities are given to an object that is not human. The camera loves him.
SIMILE	A phrase that compares one thing to another of a different kind. As blind as a bat, as bright as a button
SUPERLATIVE	A word that expresses the highest degree. bravest, best, tallest
SYNONYM	A word with the same meaning to another. SIMPLE/EASY SHORT/BRIEF RAPID/FAST
TAUTOLOGY	A phrase that includes a superfluous word. The two twins always dressed alike.
