Julius Caesar was a great Roman soldier. In less than ten years¹ he conquered what is now France, Belgium, the Netherlands, Germany and Switzerland. Caesar wrote an account of all that he did and this eventually became the first written record² of life in ancient Britain.

When fighting in France (which at the time was called Gaul) Caesar heard of an island just over the sea, which was rich³ in tin, lead and other useful metals. He gathered together⁴ eighty ships and filled them with soldiers and horsemen. In the summer of 55 BC he sailed across the channel. When he arrived at the white cliffs, he saw there was nowhere to land safely⁵ and that hundreds of Britons, ready⁶ for battle, were watching his approach. As the Roman galleys sailed along the coast looking for a safe place to land, the Britons followed⁷ them with their horses and war chariots.

Eventually the Romans turned their ships towards the shore⁸. A brave soldier took hold of a standard (a carving of a gold-coloured eagle mounted on a pole) and leapt⁹ into the water calling for men to follow him. As it was counted as a terrible disgrace¹⁰ to return from battle without a standard, the other soldiers followed. The Britons, or 'Barbarians' as the Romans called them, entered the water with their horses and weapons and a great fight took place. However, despite all their bravery¹¹, the Britons were beaten and fled. The Romans set up camp on the shore but within a few days the rough seas destroyed a lot of their ships. They had no choice¹² but to return to Gaul with what ships they had left¹³.

Caesar immediately¹⁴ began gathering together a larger army and more ships. The following summer he returned to Britain, this time with hundreds of ships and thousands of men. This time, no one met them when they landed. The Roman soldiers marched into battle against the British tribes and many lives were lost. Realizing¹⁵ that they were better fighting alongside each other, the tribes appointed¹⁶ a joint leader called Cassivellaunus who helped them work together in battle. However, the Roman soldiers were too well organized and eventually Cassivellaunus surrendered. Caesar returned to Gaul with prisoners¹⁷ and the promise¹⁸ of taxes to be paid every year. He also chose a young prince to lead the Trinovantes tribe with the offer of Roman protection. Rome had taken control over one small area of Britain.
