Comprehension - Sri Lankan Tour.

Day 1

We depart from London Heathrow on our overnight flight to Colombo. Arriving in the afternoon of day 2 - Sri Lanka is 4.5 hours ahead of UK time - and transfer to the sumptuous five star Colombo Cinnamon Lakeside Hotel, which enjoys stunning views over the Indian Ocean. We take in a sightseeing coach tour of the island's capital, Sri Jayewardenepura Kotte.

Day 3

We take a sight seeing tour of Colombo, Sri Lanka's largest city. Here, the old blends effortlessly with the new; there are beautiful temples and open green spaces amongst the grand colonial architecture and towering skyscrapers. We visit the city's most popular attraction - the chic Cinnamon Gardens, which is home to superb museums and fashionable cafes. In the afternoon we travel by rail to Kandy in central Sri Lanka where we spend the next two nights at the elegant Elephant Stables Hotel.

Day 4

In the morning of day 4, we take a guided tour of the Temple of the Tooth Relic which is said to house the tooth of Buddha. We then go on to visit Peradeniya Botanic Gardens. Previously reserved for Royalty, these beautiful gardens are Sri Lanka's largest and most impressive. This afternoon there will be an excursion to the Elephant Orphanage in Pinnawela, a remarkable project that protects and cares for the island's abandoned elephants.

Day 5

On day 5, we drive to Dambulla, where we visit the Cave Temples. These are a magnificent series of five caves dating back to the 1st century BC - and all cleverly concealed by a vast overhanging rock. Each cave is brimming with detailed watercolour frescoes and beautiful carvings and the largest cave features 150 statues of Buddha.

Day 6

Today we travel by rail on the Rajadhani Express to Nanu Oya, along the route which is widely regarded as one of the world's most scenic train journeys. From the train we admire the splendid panoramas as we pass through plains of paddy fields lined with palm trees. On arrival we transfer to Nuwara Eliya which is known locally as 'Little England' - set against a backdrop of soaring mountains, verdant valleys, and mighty waterfalls. We spend the next two nights at the iconic Grand Hotel, a landmark of the town, set in an Elizabethan-style mansion with beautiful landscaped gardens.

Day 7

On day seven we take a guided tour of the Pedro Tea Estate, 2 miles east of Nuwara Eliya. Established in 1885, we will see how tea is processed, right from picking to grading and packing. After lunch, we transfer to Yala National Park, the largest park in Sri Lanka with a wonderfully diverse landscape, including monsoon forests, dusty plains and marine wetlands. Here we take a game drive, pursuing elephants, leopards and wild boar amongst many other rare species, including a number of reptiles and aquatic birds. To increase our chances of spotting the animals, we take a second game drive in the early evening.

Day 8

Today we transfer to Beruwela which is famed for its white sandy beaches and whale-watching trips. This stretch of coastline boasts the highest concentration of Blue Whales in the world and is also a great location for spotting dolphins.

Day 9

We take our twelve hour non-stop return flight to London, arriving at 20:00 local time.

Synonyms in context - Great Wall of China

中国的长城

One of the largest engineering and <u>building</u>¹ projects ever carried out is the construction of the Great Wall of China. Originally a defensive system, today it is a major tourist attraction and a national symbol of China.

In olden times, China was <u>divided</u>² into many smaller, separate states which were often at war with each other and the rulers of the smaller states <u>began</u>³ building defensive walls as early as 400 BC. The first Qin emperor, Shihuang, <u>united</u>⁴ seven different states into one China in about 221 BC and <u>ordered</u>⁵ that the existing sections of the walls be <u>connected</u>⁶ to form one long wall to <u>protect</u>⁷ the new empire from potential invasions. The Qin Dynasty reigned until 206 BC.

During the Qin Dynasty, <u>major</u>⁸ work took place on the Great Wall and hundreds of thousands of soldiers and workers and even criminals were drafted in for the project. Many people died during its construction, due to the heavy work, short time limits and <u>tough</u>⁹ conditions.

During subsequent dynasties, the Great Wall was extended and modified¹⁰. The section built during the Han Dynasty (206 BC –220) is the longest. During the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644) the wall was substantially repaired on more than twenty occasions.

The wall is simple in structure. Different sections were built of dirt, stone, or brick, depending on the local availability of materials. The height of the wall ranges from 5 to 9 metres, with towers rising at <u>regular</u>¹¹ intervals above it. The towers were used as <u>watchtowers</u>¹² and signal towers. The wall is 8 metres wide and its total length is 8,851 kilometres.

<u>Further</u>¹³ extensive restoration took place in the twentieth century and in 1987, the Great Wall was made a World Heritage Site.

For many years, the Chinese people <u>enjoyed</u>¹⁴ the honour of having built the only manmade object on Earth that can be seen from the moon. However, this was a popular misconception; Yang Liwei, China's first astronaut, who travelled to outer space on the spacecraft Shenzhou on 15th October 2003 was asked on his return to Earth if he could see the Great Wall and his answer was a <u>definite</u>¹⁵ "No".
