The *Titanic* set sail from England on the 10th of April, 1912. The enormous ship was over three football fields long. At eleven Question 1 high and 269 metres long, it was the largest Question 2 ever built. The ship had Question 3 restaurants, an indoor swimming pool and beautiful gardens. Some of the world's richest people were travelling on board.

Just before midnight on the 14th of April, 1912, disaster struck. A huge iceberg Question 7 open *Titanic's* side. Tonnes of water poured into the ship. The lower decks quickly filled with water. Most of the ship's passengers were not rich. They were Question 8 into tiny rooms on the lower decks. People Question 9 to Question 10, but there weren't enough lifeboats to save everyone. Only about 700 people were able to get into the lifeboats. The crew of the *Carpathia* heard *Titanic's* Question 11 for help on the radio, but they arrived on the scene too late –the *Titanic* had already sunk.

They rescued the people in lifeboats, but more than 1,500 people drowned or Question 12 to death in the icy water that night.
