The *South China Evening Post* investigated and subsequently Question 3 the video to be a fake.

Vishvas News, another fact-checking platform, has undertaken a screen-by-screen Question 4 of the video and can prove that this particular blue apple was originally green and had been painted to appear blue. A closer look at the video Question 5 that the apple shown was grown along with other normal apples on the same tree.

A detailed analysis of the different marketplaces and horticulture export platforms in China has produced no evidence of a blue apple being grown, let alone being Question 6 locally or exported.
